Course Outline: DRIVER EDUCATION

- I. This is a 2 ½ credit general course for elective credit – 37 ½ hours total.
- II. Students have one initial appointment and then just drop off work into the Driver Ed box/tray. At any time, students may ask for an appointment to get help or may otherwise contact Mrs. Parker.
- III. Students **must** turn in something **every week**. If an assignment or test is not turned in, then a Weekly Update Sheet (W.U.S.) must be turned in. This form is on the Driver Ed bulletin board in Mrs. Parker’s room and is also on the school website, www.ValleyOaksSchool.org.
- IV. Students **must** come to Valley Oaks for **1 ¼ hour every week** to work on Driver Ed – grading, test taking, or just doing worksheets.
- V. Assignments
 - A. Worksheets (four sections).....(4 hours per section)
 1. Slowly and carefully write in the answers on the worksheet using the booklet.
 2. Grade your answers at school with the corrector binder & red pen. Go back to the booklet and review any pages for which you wrote incorrect worksheet answers.
 - B. Study Guides & Studying for section tests (four tests).....(3 hours each)
 1. Slowly and carefully do the Study Guide.
 2. Grade your answers at school with the corrector binder & red pen. Go back to the booklet and review any pages for which you wrote incorrect study guide answers.
 3. Study this Study Guide! - until you are certain that you will do well (88% or better) on the test.
 - C. Section Tests
 1. After completing a workbook section and its study guide *and before starting another workbook section*, study & take that section’s test.
 2. You do not pass unless you get **88% or better**.
 3. If you do not pass, then study again & retake the test. The highest score you can get on a re-take is 50%.
 4. Work that is passed an untaken or un-passed test is not accepted. Do not pick up the next workbook section & study guide until you have passed the current section’s test.
 - E. Driver Safety Project (7 ½ hr)
 1. Write the bibliographic information, take notes, & write at least 2 “I statements”, also, write your start & stop time at the top of your page.
 2. Use the DVDs, CD ROMs, VHS’s, or pamphlets on the Driver Ed shelf or attend things like “*Every Fifteen Minutes*” at PHS/CGHS or the C.H.P. “*Start Smart*”.
 3. 100 minutes must be from **watching** movies. (Ed Code)
 4. Search the web using the topic *teen driver safety* or try going to the D.M.V. website:

1. Make a study guide for the 2002 Permit Test (2hr)
2. Grade it, study it, and then take the exam.
3. If you do not get 88% or higher then you may retake it like the other tests.
